To answer this question, I throw peanut every 10 seconds to one individual for 5 minutes, counted how many times it looked backward and analyzed the relation between the reaction and its age and rank.

Through this course, I could learn how it is important to write introduction because I couldn't write it well. I could also know my lack of skills and knowledge about statistics and presentation. I'd like to study these things for my future research. This course was so meaningful for me to understand these things. What is more it was good opportunity to know students and professors.
