

From May 23<sup>th</sup> to 29<sup>th</sup>, I joined Yakushima practice. The purpose of this practice was to get an experience of combining fieldwork with laboratory work. In this study we, members of monkey team, investigated whether Japanese macaca is seed disperser or predator for Yamamomo and its relationship with body size of monkeys. In field we collected many feces and measured those diameters to estimate body size of monkeys. And after separating intact seeds and destroyed seeds of Yamamomo in feces, we measured dry weights about both types of seeds. As a result, there was significant positive correlation between diameters and ratio of destroyed seeds. In the future how the feature of Yamamomo fruits affect whether monkeys disperse or destroy seeds should be investigated. And in additional activity we collected invasive DNA samples from feces to use genome practice. This was very good experience because I must use this technique to investigate reproductive system of wild bonobos in future study. And I learned how difficult focal animal sampling is in wild environment. I want to make use of these experiences for future study. In this practice, public language was English. Though I felt necessity to learn English more, I also felt that it is possible to communicate with foreigners even if we don't have so good ability. So from now on I have an intention to communicate with foreigners actively.
