During this visit, I conducted research about a fern and analysis of its diversity. I collected sporophyte and gametophyte in Miyanoura, Onna, and Hanaage. Because gametophyte is very small, about 5mm, it is difficult to find them. While, when I carefully searched surface of soil or rocks to find gametophyte, I can found not only fern but also many unique moss and plants. I identified these fern by an illustrated reference book, and analyzed the species and the number of the species. In the result, the common species in Miyanoura, Onna, and Hanaage is only three, and I can see the fern in Yakushima is very various. Also, as sampling sites are farer from roads and deeper forest the number of species is increasing, and so I can consider that many species are preserved in undisturbed site. In addition, not only disturbance but also environment, for example humidity, can affect the diversity.

The result I got in this work will be important to understand and preserve the fern diversity in Yakushima. In the future, collecting samples in many site and analysis will be necessary.
