| <p>The International Cosmos Prize is a direct descendent of the Expo 90' in Osaka, and aims to continue to promote the Expo 90' theme “The Harmonious Coexistence between Nature and Mankind”. The Commemorative Foundation for the International Garden and Greenery Exposition awards annually the Cosmos Prize to a team or an individual, for their outstanding work promoting the equilibrium between Nature and Mankind, in either natural and social sciences and arts. The winner of the prize is honored in a ceremony and in a symposium and should also give a lecture. This year, 2017, Dr. Jane Goodall was the selected winner for the 25<sup>th</sup> edition of the award.</p> <p>Dr. Jane Goodall first started to study chimpanzees in Gombe, Tanzania, in the 1960s. Her research presented to the world the chimpanzees' ecology, behaviour and culture, that was unknown until then and which showed how thin is the gap between humans and chimpanzees. Moreover, her passionate work brought to light the need to protect and conserve this species. After her fieldwork, Dr. Jane Goodall focused on environmental education activities and has been travelling around the world ever since, promoting several</p> |

ジェーン・グドール博士は、「進化の隣人」である野生チンパンジーの研究を1960年に開始し、チンパンジーのシロアリ釣り代表される道具の使用や制作、長期にわたる母子のきずなの重要性の発見、近年では、チンパンジーが使用する道具に地域ごとに異なる文化が存在することを突き止めるなど、野生チンパンジーの全体像を描き出すことに尽力されました。今回の講演ではこれら研究にまつわるエピソードや、研究を発端として創案され、世界中に広がりをみせている環境教育プログラム「ルーツアンドシューツ」などについてお話いただきます。
