**Asking and Answering Questions after a Presentation: Student Practice 3**

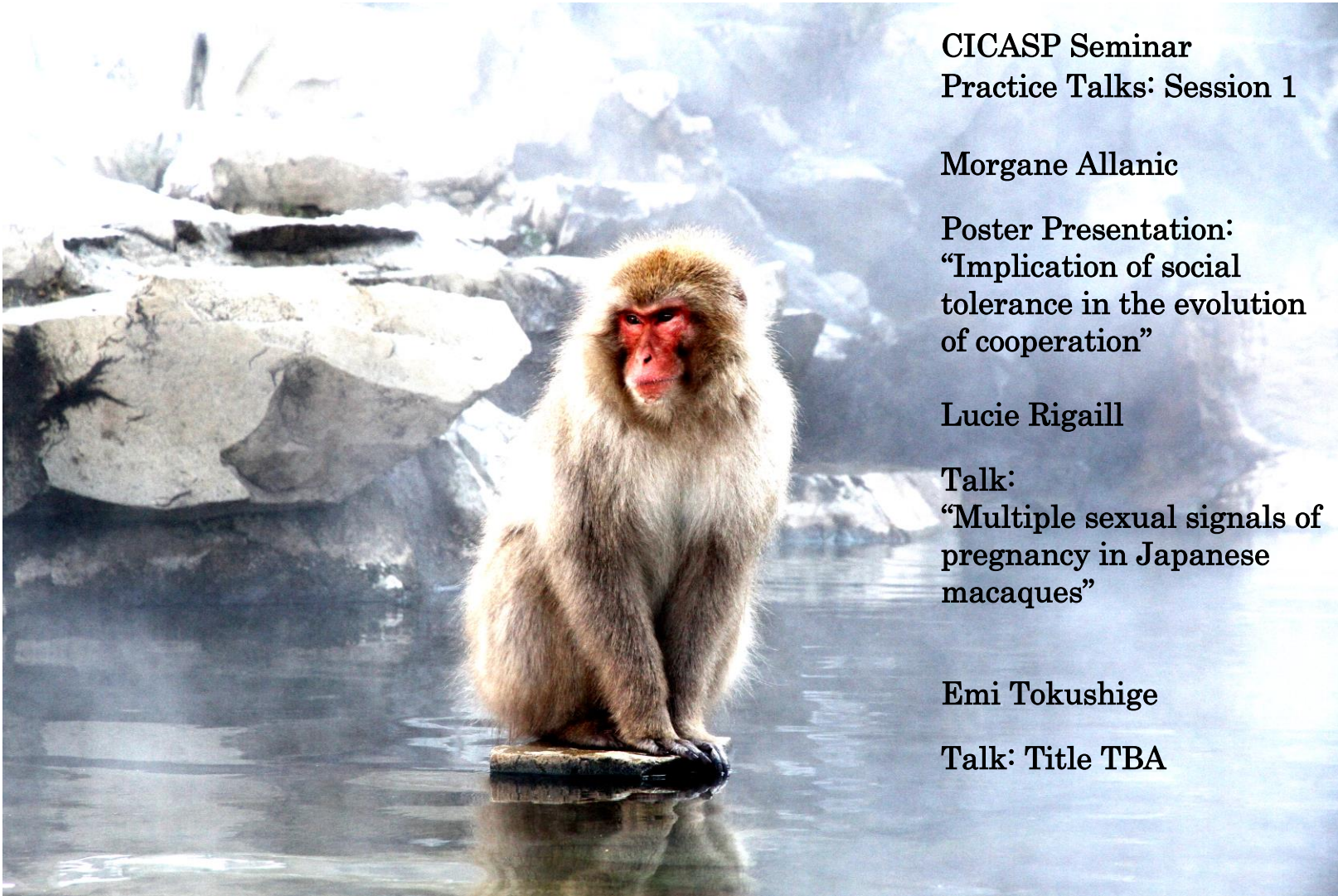
