In this seminar, we will seek the answers by revisiting foundational studies in primatology and wildlife science. We want you—a scientist at the forefront of your chosen field—to nominate a classic paper in your discipline and share its significance with your colleagues at PRI and WRC.

Please join this seminar with a classic paper of your choice (it'll be helpful to have a PDF to share), that is, a foundational paper of broad importance that you would recommend future graduate students at PRI and WRC to read. During the seminar, you will: (1) help us compile a list of such papers; (2) have small-group discussions with colleagues from your research unit (so bring your friends and lab mates!); and (3) prepare a quick presentation introducing the paper of your choice to everyone in the following seminar (currently scheduled for 7/8).
